Petitioner, a pro se interested party in a bankruptcy case, has filed a petition for review of Chief Judge Barron's order dismissing petitioner's complaint, under 28 U.S.C. § 351(a), against a bankruptcy judge in the First Circuit. Chief Judge Barron dismissed the misconduct complaint as not indicative of misconduct and as frivolous, pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 352(b)(1)(A)(i) and 352(b)(1)(A)(iii), and Rules for Judicial-Conduct and Judicial-Disability Proceedings (Rules of Judicial-Conduct), Rules 11(c)(1)(A) and 11(c)(1)(C). A review panel of the Judicial Council of the First Circuit has considered the petition for review and the relevant materials, and has concluded that the petition for review should be denied for the reasons stated in Chief Judge Barron's order of dismissal. See Rules of Judicial-Conduct, Rules 18(a) and 19(b)(1), and First Circuit Local Rule 19(a).

Accordingly, the order of dismissal issued in Judicial Misconduct Complaint No. 01-22-90002 is affirmed.
