To be considered for membership on the CJA panel for the United States Court of Appeals for the First Circuit, an attorney must be a member of the bar of the Court in good standing; must have a demonstrated knowledge of, and experience with, federal criminal law and appellate procedure; must have a commitment to indigent criminal defense; and must be willing to accept at least one CJA appellate appointment each year.

Please submit **three** paper copies of the following documents to the Office of the Clerk of Court, John Joseph Moakley United States Courthouse, One Courthouse Way, Suite 2500, Boston, MA 02210:

- A fully completed questionnaire. All questions must be answered. If a question does not apply, answer "not applicable."
- Your current resume
- An appellate brief you have prepared in the last four years (preferably not an Anders brief). If you wish to include an older brief because it is a better representation of your work, you may do so in addition to a recent brief.
- A copy of the court opinion (see question 6(b))
- A declaration that you were the sole or primary author of the brief. If you have not prepared a brief, you may substitute another writing sample.

Applications cannot be submitted electronically.**
