- A copy of the court opinion (see question 6(b)).
- A signed declaration that you were the sole or primary author of the brief. If you have not prepared a brief, you may substitute another writing sample.

Application packages must be received no later than June 13, 2025, at 5:00 p.m. Applications cannot be submitted electronically.
