# Lay vs. Lie: Usage Guide

Lay has been used intransitively in the sense of "lie" going to *lay* down for a quick nap

since the 14th century. The practice was unremarked until around 1770; attempts to correct it have been a fixture of schoolbooks ever since. Generations of teachers and critics have succeeded in taming most literary and learned writing, but intransitive *lay* persists in familiar speech and is a bit more common in general prose than one might suspect. Much of the problem lies in the confusing similarity of the principal parts of the two words. Another influence may be a folk belief that *lie* is for people and *lay* is for things. Some commentators are ready to abandon the

# Choose the Right Synonym for *lie*

LIE, PREVARICATE, EQUIVOCATE, PALTER, FIB mean to tell an untruth.

LIE is the blunt term, imputing dishonesty.

PREVARIGATE softens the bluntness of LIE by implying quibbling or confusing the issue.

during the hearings the witness did his best to prevaricate

**EQUIVOCATE** implies using words having more than one sense so as to seem to say one thing but intend another.
