Definition of *acquire*

transitive verb

1 : to get as one's own:

a: to come into possession or control of often by unspecified means acquire property The team acquired three new players this year.

b: to come to have as a new or added characteristic, trait, or ability (as by sustained effort or natural selection) acquire fluency in Frenchbacteria that acquire tolerance to antibiotics 2: to locate and hold (a desired object) in a detector acquire a target by radar

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First Known Use of acquire

15th century, in the meaning defined at sense 1

History and Etymology for *acquire*

borrowed from Latin acquirere, from ad- ad- + quaerere "to seek, gain, obtain, enquire"; replacing earlier aquere, going back to Middle English aqweren, borrowed from Anglo-French acquerre, going back to Vulgar Latin *acquaerere, restructuring (by restoring the vocalism of quaerere) of acquirere — more at quest entry 1
