1590s, earlier yland (c.1300), from Old English igland "island," from ieg "island" (from Proto-Germanic *aujo "thing on the water," from PIE *akwa- "water;" see aqua- (/browse/aqua-)) + land "land." Spelling modified 15c. by association with

similar but unrelated isle (/browse/isle). An Old English cognate was *ealand* "river-land, watered place, meadow by a river." In place names, Old English *ieg* is often used of "slightly raised dry ground offering settlement sites in areas surrounded by marsh or subject to flooding" [Cambridge Dictionary of English Place-Names]. Related: *Islander*.
